He and his family lived in Links View Cottage. There is no doubt he served an apprenticeship as a golf club maker, but we do not know whether it was with Scott or Forrester although he was a time served golf clubmaker at least by 1931. He was as usual a prominent golfer in Elie and Earlsferry and won a number of medals of the golf club. But he shot to prominence when he won the Eden Tournament at St Andrews in 1931 beating T. Rodger of St. Andrews in the final. By all reports this was not a classic final, but it served to suggest to Bill Thomson that a career could be made as a professional golfer standing his experience as a club maker and no doubt reports from his contemporaries. 1931

It looks as if he turned professional (although in these days the requirements were rather less stringent) and shortly thereafter joined Royal Berkshire at Ascot as an assistant. Then in 1933 this newspaper report appeared:

IFROM OUR SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE Sr Andrews, Saturday

Tun Eden Tournament produced a new winner here to-day in William C. B. Thomson, a young Barisferry handiesp golfer of hitherto only local reputation, who defeated Tom Rodger, St. Andrews, in the 35 holes final by 6 and 5. The trophy therefore goes back to Earliferry, James Braid's native place, after an interval of a year, for J. N. Smith won it in 1929. Last year's winner was R. W. Penttie, who bout Smith in tho final.

Thomson, who is 21 years of age, a clubmaker, and son of the scorctary of the Earlsferry Thistic Gelf Club, thus won his first open event at the end of a week remarkable for its requence of surprise results, a feature to which the winner himself was a notable contributor. In a final which brought these two Fife players into general notice, Thousand was distinctly the steadier and kept a better control of the ball in the stiff chilly wind that blew from the cast. From this it is possible that he was firstly attached to Formby, but we know that he turned professional in early 1932 after his Eden win. We have no reference to him having been at Formby or Beaconsfield although he certainly was at Ascot before Bradley Hall. There are at least two discrepancies in this report. Firstly, in relation to Elie but he actually won the tournament in 1931 and not 1930.

Berkshire Club Assistant Joins Bradley Hall

W. C. Thomson, a former Scottish amateur, who won the Eden Tournament at St. Andrews in 1930 and is now engaged as an assistant professional at the Berkshire Golf Club, Tower Hill, Ascot, has been appointed professional to the Bradley Hall Club, Halifax, in succession to Allan Dailey, who has just gone to Addington.

Thomson is a slightly-built man of 23 years, who halls from Elie, twelve miles south of St. Andrews. While a member of the Earlsferry and Elie Golf Clubs he played in many amateur tournaments in Flifeshire, and in 1930, playing from scratch, he won the Eden Tournament at St. Andrews out of a record entry of 347 players.

In February of this year he won the Guildford Alliance Cup at Tyrells Wood. He qualified in the recent Assistants' Tournament at Moor Park with scores of 78 and 75, but was defeated by J. E. Field, of Sunningdale, at the last green in one of the best matches of the tournament.

Thomson was assistant to the late W. McEwan, at Formby, and has also served as an assistant at Beaconsfield and Ascot. He is a skilled club maker and coach, and the Bradley Hall officials are satisfied that they

Bradley Hall officials are satisfied that they have found an excellent successor to Dailey, Thomson played there on Sunday last, and his smooth and rhythmic swing impressed the officials of the club. 1933

GOLF ASSISTANT'S SUCCESS

W. C. B. Thomson Wins Guildford Alliance Competition

W. C. B. Thomson, assistant professional to the Berkshire Golf Club, won the Guild-ford Alliance competition at Tyrrells Wood yesterday with a scratch score of 73. Thomson was formerly an Earlsferry club-maker and in 1931 won the Eden tournament at St Andrews. The field he heat yesterday included A. Perry. Gus Faulkner, W. M. Watt and H. B. Rhodes.

The best score in the qualifying round at Barnehurst yesterday for the Kent County women's foursomes tournament was 79 by Mrs. Patterson and Mrs. Smith. He played in a number of professional tournaments out of Bradley Hall and lived in Elland in Yorkshire until 1940 when this report appeared:



We are not sure how long he was at Southport, but it is significant that he lived in at 7 Windsor Road Southport before 1950. By then he had two daughters. Isobel born in 1938 and Susan born in 1947.

W. B. Thomson, the Bradley Hall (Halifax) golf club's professional since November, 1933, has resigned that office and gone to Southport. Frank Crossley, who has been steward for three years, is acting temporarily in Thomson's place.

We cannot find reference to anything he may have done at Southport which is not surprising during the war.

However in 1950 he and his family set off for Canada . Whether he left on spec is difficult to know but very soon he seems to have established himself first in Ontario at Port Arthur in Thunder Bay where he was professional for 5 or so years.

In the meantime his first wife Connie had died and he remarried Ida Thomson, who died in 1989. He lived in Holly Avenue in Winnipeg.

Born in Eagles Ferry, Fyfeshire on May 5, 1920, Bill immigrated to Canada in 1950 following a career as a Professional Golfer in Scotland and later England. He resumed his golf career as Head Professional at Port Arthur Golf and Country Club in Thunder Bay, followed by 20 years as Head Professional at Southwood Golf & Country Club. Bill received the title of Professional Emeritus on his retirement in 1975 and participated in the Bill Thomson Invitational Golf Tournament which continued for some 25 years. Bill is survived by his daughter Susan of Naples, FL and was predeceased by his daughter Isabelle and his wife Connie, and second wife Ida. A service to commemorate his life will be held on Tuesday, May 29 at 10:30 a.m. at Neil Bardal Inc., 984 Portage Ave., entrance on Aubrey Street with Mrs. Catherine Kinsman officiating.
